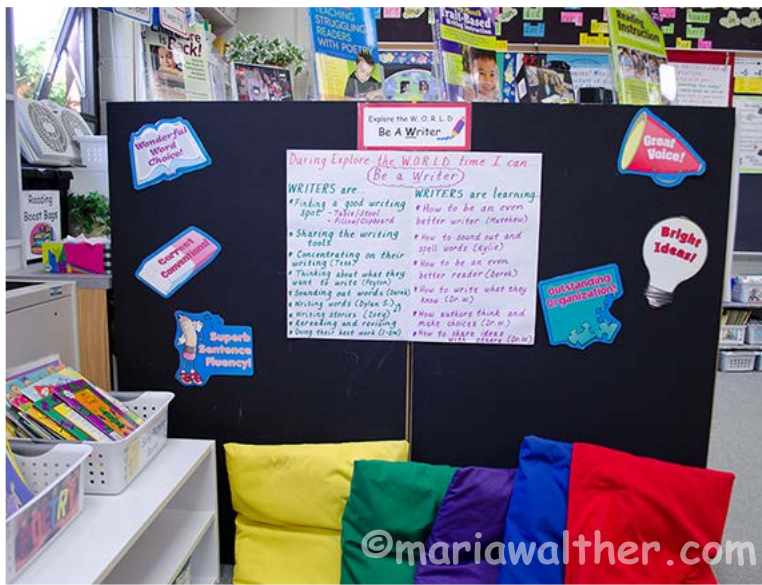
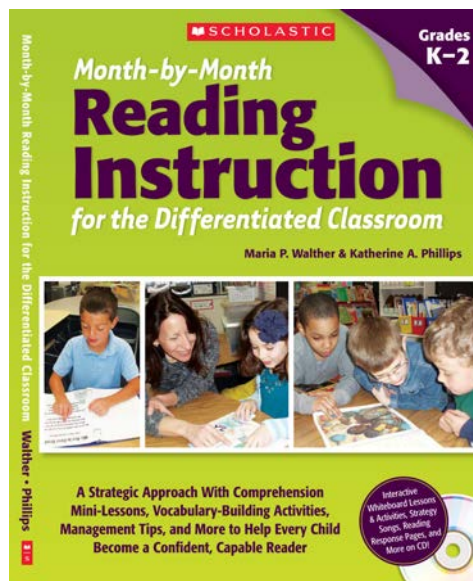




BE A WRITER



After launching, modeling, and practicing expectations, create an anchor chart.

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Surround your writing center with books. When children are looking for ideas, alphabet books and wordless books are helpful.



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Add to the Writing Center Menu as you introduce different types of books. For Reproducible Books see Print Resources.



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To save space, take the legs out of the table and use pillows on the floor. You can use the space under the table to store extra supplies.

To model expectations, take photographs of the children working in the center and post nearby.



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
